C. The "University Faculty" (sometimes referred to herein as "the Faculty") shall mean the body defined as such in the Bylaws of Cornell University, as now in effect or as amended from time to time hereafter. At present, the Faculty comprises: (1) as voting members, the President, Professors Emeriti, University professors, professors-at-large in residence, and all professors, associate professors and assistant professors and all courtesy professorial ranks of the several colleges, schools and separate academic departments, divisions and centers at Ithaca and Geneva; (2) as nonvoting members, the professors in (a) the Medical College and (b) those bearing the adjunct, visiting or acting title; and (3) such other persons as may have been, or may hereafter be, elected by the Board of Trustees, upon the recommendation of the Faculty, to voting or non-voting membership therein (Bylaws of Cornell University, Article XII, Section 1). 	Research-Teaching-Extension (RTE) faculty with voting rights are those who have the title research professor (all ranks), clinical professor (all ranks), professor-of-the-practice (all ranks), lecturer (all ranks), research associate (all ranks), extension associate (all ranks), senior scientist, senior scholar, research scientist, principal research scientist, librarian (all ranks), or archivist (all ranks).
	RTE faculty without voting rights are those who have the title visiting scientist, visiting critic, visiting scholar, visiting fellow, instructor, or teaching associate as well as those whose title is modified by "visiting", "acting", or "courtesy".

Notes. This modification of Article IX-C expands the Faculty Senate so that it includes College RTE members and an RTE-designated seat for the Library. The non-voting ex officio status for ROTC, the Student Assembly, the Graduate and Professional Student Assembly, and the Employee Assembly is made explicit. The non-voting ex officio seat for post-docs is new.

The alternate has voting rights and will count towards the quorum only when the regular senator is absent.
	Each college shall have at least one College RTE seat in the Senate. Colleges with more than 25 voting RTE faculty will have a second College RTE seat. Colleges with more than 100 voting RTE faculty will have a third College RTE seat. In this context the colleges are (1) Agriculture and Life Science, (2) Architecture, Art, and Planning, (3) Arts and Sciences, (4) S.C. Johnson College of Business, (5) Computing and Information Science, (6) Engineering (7) Human Ecology, (8) Industrial and Labor Relations, (9) Law, and (10) Veterinary Medicine.

Notes. By deleting "tenured" in paragraph 1 we are making it legal for an emeritus/a faculty member to serve as Dean of Faculty. The Emeriti are voting members of the University Faculty, but because they have retired, the do not have tenure status. The voting members of the University Faculty and the voting members of the RTE faculty elect the Dean of Faculty.
